

Family Virtual College Tour

Family Member: Share one reason why you are excited for your student to go to college? Next, each person takes a sheet of loose-leaf paper and a pencil. Working separately, illustrate your ideal college. If you do not want to draw, you may also describe your ideal college in words. Include at least four college categories that are most important to you, <i>for example</i>: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Size: Do you prefer a small, medium, or large college? ➤ Location: Would you prefer to stay in New York City or go away to school? ➤ Major: What would you like to study most in college? ➤ Extracurricular activities: Which sport(s) or club(s) would you like to join?
