Journaling Expectations

At the beginning of each class, Ms. Russo will play a new piece of music. You will be asked to *listen* and write a journal entry (around 3-5 sentences) in the back of your notebook responding to the question:

“What do you hear?”

You can write about *anything* you hear in the music! In case you are not sure what to write about, here are some suggestions:

- ❖ What instruments you hear
- ❖ What the words are and what you think they mean
- ❖ What mood or emotion the music makes you feel
- ❖ What genre of music (like pop, jazz, rock, classical, etc.) the song could be from
- ❖ What the music reminds you of (maybe another song or type of music)

Reminders:

- Write the date at the top of your journal
- Write the name of the song under your paragraph when Ms. Russo writes it on the board

*Journaling entries will be read periodically and count for quiz grades.
